Civilla D. Martin wrote "His Eye is on the Sparrow" in 1904 while she was sitting with a lady who was bedridden. Martin asked this lady if she ever got discouraged, and the lady talked about how God cares for the sparrow. It wasn't long before this beloved song was on paper. This song is embedded in our anthem, "I Sing Because I'm Happy". In Matthew and Luke we read that God numbers the sparrows so he surely cares for us. Thinking of a bird during hard times may not be our first thought, but the hidden meaning is that if God cares for something as insignificant as a bird, then how much more He cares for us. The anthem's words also say we're free! Only we who are saved because of Jesus's sacrifice on the cross can truly sing about happiness and freedom. Isaiah 61:1 says:

The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, Because the Lord anointed me To proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, To proclaim freedom for the captives And release from darkness for the prisoners.
